
For Vibraphone, Cello, and Bass (2011)

This piece uses the acceleration of the vibraphone's motor as an aesthetic framework for the whole piece. The speed of the motor is notated as a graph below the conventional notation for the vibraphone. The bottom of the graph denotes the slowest motor speed and the top of the graph denotes the fastest speed. If there is no line that means to leave the motor at it's current speed. After an extended notated section, the vibraphone plays a solo melody and the cello and bass gradually enter the texture. The trio then moves into a collective contextual improvisation using the content of the piece as material for improvisation. The piece ends with a read through of the final notated material cued in by the vibraphonist.



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
